We explored the accounts of these various chapters of salvation history by engaging in some fun activities.


It was great to have a fun, engaging week with the students and a big thank you to all who attended and those who helped too!

CELEBRATING CHRIST'S ENTRY INTO HEAVEN



Spotlight on: the Sacred Heart...

In the Catholic Church, the month of June is traditionally dedicated to the Sacred Heart of Jesus. A devotion is where we focus our prayer (usually for a specific period of time) on one aspect of our faith, in this case it is Jesus' Sacred Heart, which was physically pierced on Calvary by a lance, but was also pierced spiritually because He loved us so much, it hurt for Him to see humanity reject God through sin.

In 1673, St. Margaret Mary Alacoque, a French nun, received visions of Jesus which continued for 18 months. Jesus told her to encourage a devotion to His Sacred Heart, which He said "is so passionately in love with humanity that it can no longer contain within itself the flames of its

ardent love. It must pour them out through [you], and manifest itself to them with its precious treasures, which contain all the graces which they need to be saved."

Jesus also asked that a day be dedicated to celebrating the Sacred Heart, which is the Friday after the Feast of Corpus Christi (Friday 16th June this year).

So then, let us spend this June trying and praying to grow closer to Jesus and His Sacred Heart!
