This devotional reflects on the scriptures of incarnation and exaltation in order to take you on a journey of thoughtful self-reflection. May you find joy and discover strength as you walk this wondrous journey to Bethlehem, always holding within your heart the image of the Hill of Calvary and the hope of the Age to come when Christ will return to call his people home!

Incarnation – And Mary said, "My soul magnifies the Lord, and my spirit rejoices in God my Saviour, for he has regarded the low estate of his handmaiden. For behold, henceforth all generations will call me blessed; for he who is mighty has done great things for me, and holy is his name." (Luke 1:46-49)

Exaltation – "For behold, days are coming, says the LORD, when I will restore the fortunes of my people, Israel and Judah, says the LORD, and I will bring them back to the land which I gave to their fathers, and they shall take possession of it." (Jeremiah 30:3)

The Magnificat was a personal prayer and a prophetic word that burst forth from the lips of Mary. She who had submitted completely to the call of God could not contain the profound truth and incredible joy that had filled her heart. Like the words of the prophet Jeremiah, her sweet song sang of coming home, of restoration, salvation, and eternal glory. It was a deep and profound message for all who would experience the Saviour. Mary's words echoed the words of the Old Testament saints; and yet, they were her own. Through her servant's heart, these words have become our words as well!

These words teach us that we too need a Saviour as we long to come home. They show us that God keeps his promises and works out his plan in the perfection of his great love. We become a link on the long chain of salvation history, connecting to the eternal through the coming of the baby of Bethlehem. We become God's servants and carry the Christmas message to all the world as we live out the power and presence of the Saviour in our lives. What a tremendous blessing that is!



VATICANO-Pope: In a noisy world there is need for silence to contemplate God.



The Holy Father conveyed his happiness in greeting the Conceptionist Mothers, especially acknowledging the presence of those who travelled from Argentina, his homeland. Reflecting on the extraordinary life of Mother Ágreda, Pope Francis highlighted three lessons that the woman offers to the Church and humanity at large. **Silence** "The first lesson is silence," the Pontiff began, emphasising the significance of listening and embracing the voice of the Beloved, the eternal Word of the Father. He underlined the unique capacity of women to listen and their special vocation in doing so. "Women know how to listen and have a special vocation to listen," he added, noting that some religious sisters, even without specific training, acquired a profound knowledge of Scripture and drew from it "as from a living fountain".

Mysticism Continuing his discourse, the Holy Father turned to the second lesson: mysticism, an intimate relationship with God arising from the attentive study of Sacred Scripture. He explained that the essence of this was transcending self-centeredness and making space for God.

Mission The third and final lesson centred on mission, exemplified by Mother Ágreda and the Concepcionist nuns. The Holy Father highlighted the missionary spirit inherent in contemplative life, echoing the sentiments later emphasised by St. Therèse of the Child Jesus. Finally, drawing parallels from the wedding at Cana, the Holy Father emphasised Mary's pivotal role in revealing

Christ. "Mary never does this, Mary points to her son, she reveals him at Cana," he concluded.

December 21, 1118: Thomas Becket, the Archbishop of Canterbury who clashed with England's King Henry II, is born in London.

December 22, 1917: Francesca Xavier Cabrini, founder of the Missionary Sisters of the Sacred Heart, dies in Chicago's Columbus Hospital. In 1946 she was canonized by the Roman Catholic Church, becoming the first American citizen declared a saint.
